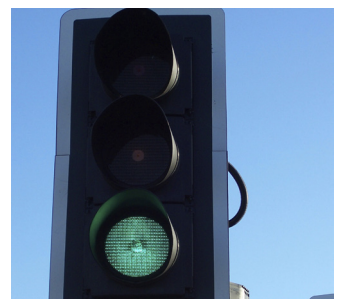

- 1 Traffic Warden, Policeman, Road crossing patrol?
- 2 By using a footbridge or subway
- 3 One tram may be hiding behind another tram. Make sure you can see both ways before crossing the tracks
- 4 Where you can see for a long way in each direction
- 5 Other drivers of cars and vans are concentrating on passing the bus at the stop and may not notice you crossing behind the bus
- 6 Buses have large wing mirrors which stick out of the side of the bus and may hit you if you're too near the road edge. Trams are actually wider than the tram tracks and you need to step away from the kerb edge before boarding.
- 7 Many cars and buses are electric and therefore almost silent so you won't hear them approaching
- 8 Stand a step away from the kerb and hold out your hand
- 9 Eight! CCTV on buses can see everyone on board
- 10 Keep looking and listening
- 11 When the green man shows
- 12 It makes the bus journey quicker and lets the buses jump to the front of the queue
- 13 No. Traffic will start to move soon
- 14 Bright colours
- 15 White and reflective materials
- 16 Carry on crossing, quickly and safely
- 17 The head
- 18 12-15 years
- 19 Fog/Rain/Snow/Sun in your eyes - difficult to see.
Wet/Icy/Snowy roads, difficult to stop easily
- 20 Can distract the driver and cause them to make a mistake
